Gloria Ellington is still carrying that big College Park ring - must be love!

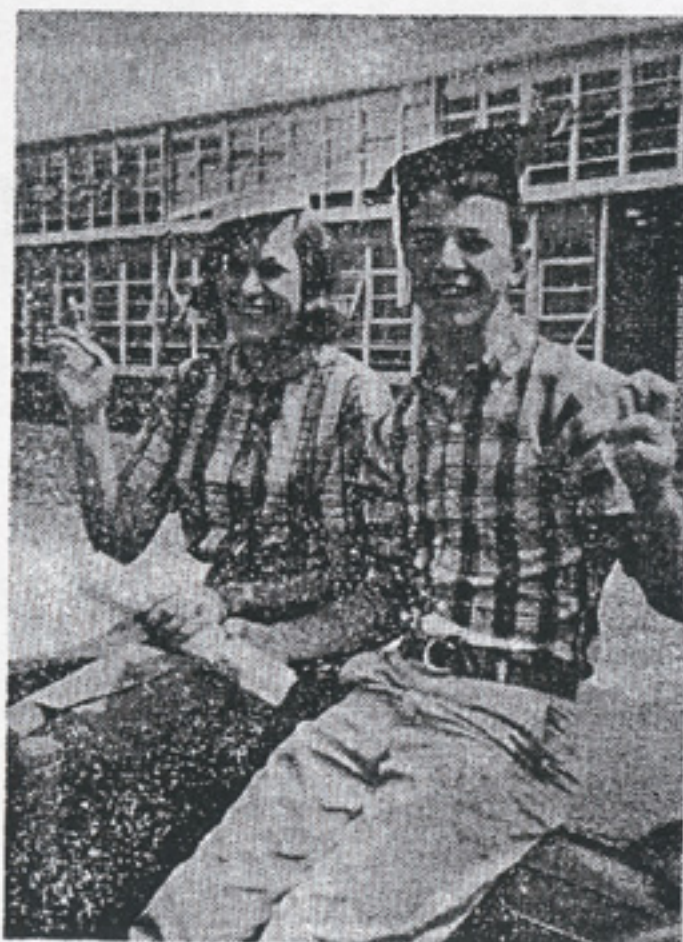
